DEPARTMENT-SPECIFIC 191/197:

191 Experiential Learning and 197 Independent Research are both units that students can take repeatedly. Both are faculty-guided and individualized to the student's research interests and exploration of a topic. Ask a faculty member if they're willing to mentor you for a 191 or 197 during their office hours!

FACULTY RESEARCH LABS:

The Pacific Research and Scholarship Day is Pacific's annual celebration of all students who do research! Submit an abstract with the support of a faculty advisor, and prepare a poster to be presented at the conference!

SURF:

Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowships at Pacific offer students faculty-mentored research, with various financial supports. Whether the student is a freshman or a seasoned member of the lab, SURFs are a great way to expand their research experience.

GRANTS (ASUOP/UGR):

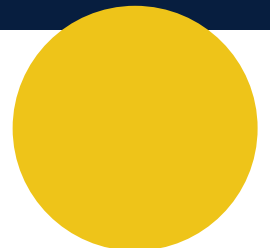
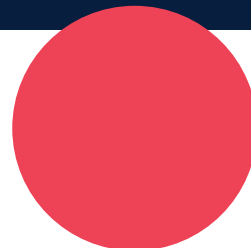
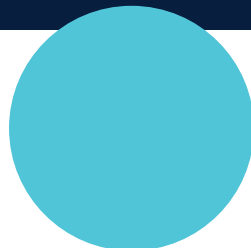

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY:

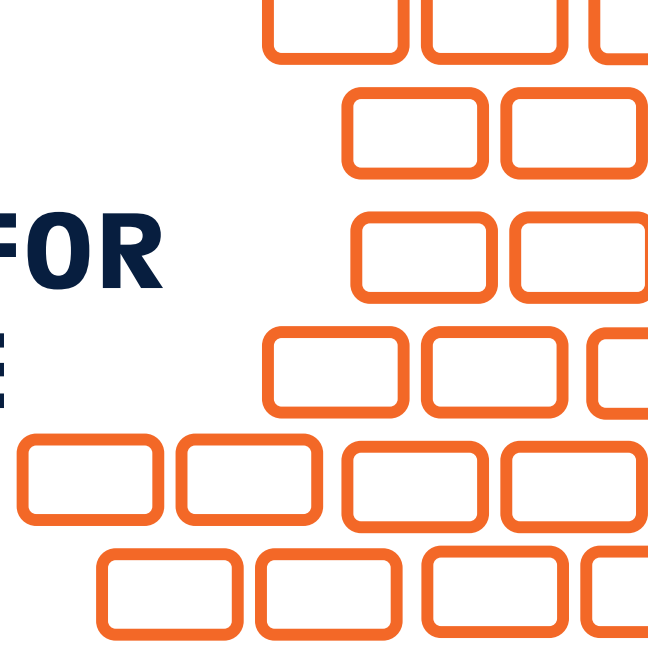

BIG 10 ALLIANCE SROP:

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is a group of 14 major research institutions, and they offer year-to-year summer research opportunities. Deadlines are rolling from early February to March depending on the institution, and different opportunities are offered based on faculty availability at the institution.

LEADERSHIP ALLIANCE:

The Leadership Alliance is a consortium of higher education institutions that aim to develop underrepresented students for leadership roles in academia, the public, and private sectors. Through this alliance, the Summer Research Early Identification Program (SR-EIP) is offered, which is a fully funded summer research fellowship, targeted towards students seeking enrollment in PhD or MD-PhD programs.

PREDOC:

The Pathways to Research and Doctoral Careers program is a consortium of various higher education institutions seeking to create a more diverse group of social scientists in various fields that seek to create impactful research. PreDOC offers a variety of resources, such as asynchronous online courses on data software, synchronous summer courses with a stipend, and a database of full-time research assistant positions.
